Bachelor of Arts, Media Arts, Producing Option 2007--2008 Catalog

The BA degree requires a minimum of 120 units of which 42 must be upper division units. (Upper division courses are numbered 300-499).

No more than 64 units may be transferred from a two-year college.

This major requires a minimum of 49 units of which 18 must be upper division units. (Upper division courses are numbered 300-499).

Registration in upper division (300/400 level) Media Arts courses requires Advanced Standing in Media Arts, including a 2.5 GPA (overall) and completion of the five lower division (100/200 level) Media Arts courses.
